Where We Met

The charming city of Savannah, GA was the site of this year's reunion, and our Holiday Inn hotel illustrated what Southern Hospitality means. We had a large hospitality suite for breakfasts, socializing and for the Sunday evening banquet.

What We Did

On Thursday most of the crew arrived, by cars and planes. A large group of us had dinner in Carlito's Mexican Bar and Grill in the historic district.

Friday was tour day, including a narrated bus tour of Savannah in the morning and a paddle-wheel river boat cruise in the afternoon. Lunch and dinner were at various local restaurants.

Our memorial service, complete with color guard, was held Saturday afternoon at the Chapel of the Fallen Eagles, on the grounds of the Mighty Eighth Air Force museum. A tour of the museum followed the service, and the day ended with a buffet dinner, live music and great fellowship.

Sunday was the concluding day of the reunion. Some of us toured other parts of Savannah and its surrounding sites before the afternoon business meeting and spirited and profitable auction. The banquet in our hospitality suite featured more live classical guitar music by Joe Flanders, USS Savage challenge coins, and some beautifully dressed ladies who graced our tables.

The Raffle

We acquired the rights to use three digital images of photos taken of the USS Savage (DE-386) during construction and launch at Brown Shipyard in Houston in 1943. Ed Stone made large prints of them, had them framed, and sold raffle tickets with the photos as prizes. We earned \$500 on that activity.

The Auction

During the business meeting the subject of our lagging efforts to raise enough money to have a plaque designed by shipmate Dan Farley, Sr. made and installed at the Mt. Soledad Memorial in San Diego was brought up. We voted to devote the day's auction proceeds to that effort. The auction broke all known records for our association, with over \$1,200 raised. This will enable us to complete the memorial plaque project. Perhaps we will all be able to see it at the next west coast reunion.

New Association Officers

Our President, Jim Murphy, and Treasurer, Gloria Wilson (both of whom have done a great job) declined to run for re-election. At the business meeting we elected a full slate of officers. They are: Dan Dykstra, president; Paul Doster, vice-president; Ed Stone, secretary; Tom Hendricks, treasurer; Ray Ewing, historian; and Dan Dykstra, chaplain. Congrats!

Framed Savage Prints Available

Two framed 1943 USS Savage construction and launching prints raffled and auctioned at the reunion generated considerable interest, and Ed Stone has started taking orders for additional copies. If you would like to purchase framed or unframed prints of any or all of the three images in 8X10 or 12 ½ X 16 ½ size, please contact Ed. The price for framed ones is \$150 plus shipping for one large **or** two small prints in one frame. Shipping could add another \$60 or so. This is our cost plus \$5, for the Savage Reunion Association treasury, to subsidize the cost of mailing newsletters and directories to those who do not have email.



The frame on the left measures 19" X 21 1/4", and the one on the right measures 15 3/4" X 22 3/4". Framing is done at the Lyons Share Gallery in Fairhope, AL.

Unframed prints on 13X19 Canon Photo Paper Pro Luster cost \$40 apiece (same price one went for at the auction), and $8 1/2 \times 11$ prints on the same paper cost \$25 each, plus shipping.
